

Camp Mack Healthcare Personnel (HCP)

The Camp Mack Healthcare Personnel are volunteers that serve at camp for a week (or more). They give a holistic approach to health through preventative care, medication administration, following standing orders for commonly seen illness and injury, communication with guardians, and referring to higher care as needed.

Reports to: Program Director

Certifications Required: RN, NP, PA, DO, or MD

- Any personnel below a RN must be supervised daily and logs checked by an RN or above.
- All HCP must have current certification in Adult/Child CPR/AED and First Aid. (Camp Mack staff is trained in ARC CPR/AED for the professional rescuer)

Job Description:

- HCP is onsite and on call 24/7 during the duration of a camp and is in the health center during med call/clinic hours.
- Serve from the camp health office. A mobile health office may be set up for weeks with a single camp or wilderness camping

Responsibilities:

- Staff the medication check in table at check in
- Administer Rx and OTC medications per instruction
- Manage med call times
- Perform to the standard of care to your certification
- Recognize signs and symptoms of illness and injury
- Follow standing orders for common illness and injuries
- Respond to emergencies including all Waterfront Emergencies
- Return medications to campers at the end of camp
- Proper documentation in log books, incident reports, and state reporting forms
- Give Program Director a list of any supplies to be restocked.
