Snickerdoodles Ingredients:

4 Čups Butter
8 Cups White Sugar
8 Eggs
4 Teaspoons Vanilla
2 Teaspoons Baking Soda
2 Teaspoons Cream of
Tarter
12 Cups Flour

Instructions:

In a mixing bowl, cream together butter, sugar, vanilla, and eggs. Combine the dry ingredients and slowly add to the creamed mixture. Roll dough into balls, and dip them in a cinnamon sugar mixture (1 cup white sugar and ¼ cup cinnamon).

Bake in a preheated, 350 degree conventional oven, or in a 300 degree convection oven on ungreased baking sheets for 8 to 10 minutes.

Makes about 10 dozen cookies.

Summer Camp of 2024 is underway. It started with 4-H camp, and it was good to hear the sound of kids playing and enjoying this sanctuary space. For the most part, the facility crew was ready. Cory, Keith, and I had spent a good bit of time preparing for this moment.

For the last couple of years, we have wanted to put a new roof on the lakeside shelter. With your help, we had the funds to do that this year! Mast Construction came in about a month ago and put on a nice, pretty, new metal roof that matches the roof on Sarah Major. I don't know how old that structure is, but it has a pretty good structure to it, so it may be good for another 50 years.

There has been some concern the past few years about the looks of the service drive. We tend to put old, used stuff there that might be useful someday or we just don't know what to do with it. The facility crew was encouraged to clean it up. This spring, Church of God (COG) had their annual work day at Camp and helped us sort through it. It was a bit painful, but we filled a roll off dumpster with used steel and another one with broken concrete pieces from past projects. That sure made a big difference. Thanks to our COG friends!

An issue we have been facing for the past several years is the flooding of the trail to the Living Cross tree. It continues to get wetter and wetter. We had a conversation with a county drain board head discussing options. It is a designated wetland, and there are some serious limitations as to what we can do to correct the flow of water that comes down Hammond Ditch. The best option may be to construct some sort of elevated walkway and let mother nature take her course with the wetland. If you have any thoughts, let us know.

This spring has been a good season for volunteers. Several individuals and a few groups came alongside us to help prepare this sanctuary for another season. It is such a lift to have that help and we are very thankful. Blessings on all,
