



CAMP MACK 2025 Summer Camp Info

Deposits

To be fully registered for a summer camp, a non-refundable deposit of \$75 must be received. If a deposit is not received, your spot for the camp is not reserved. Full payment is expected by June 1st.

Refund Policy

Any cancellations received 30 days prior to your camp start date will receive a full refund minus the \$75 deposit. Cancellations received less than 30 days prior to your camp start date will receive a refund of ½ of the registration minus the \$75 deposit. If a child does not arrive for camp, all registration fees are forfeited.

Financial Assistance for Summer Camps

Camp Mack offers several ways to help cover the cost of summer camp. Payment Plans break down the cost of camp into automatic monthly payments for up to a six-month period. Camperships (camp scholarships) for up to half of the registration fee are available through the camp for families needing financial assistance. First Time Camper Discount

Campers coming to Camp Mack for the first time can receive a \$50 discount on their camp fees. Campers must be registered by May 1st to be eligible for the discount.

Church Transfer Codes

Does your church cover the cost of attending camp? Ask your camp representative for your church's transfer code to automatically remove the amount your church is paying from your balance.

Personal Conduct

Church camp is about living in Christian Community. In an attempt to provide an atmosphere where children can live together in that community, campers are expected to: participate and cooperate in activities, respect one another, use no profanity, wear modest and appropriate clothing, and have behavior that is not disruptive to the program. The camp reserves the right to send home a camper who is unable to function within these guidelines.


Volunteer Work Days

Letter from the Executive Director

Life can be frightening. News from the world describes the violence of war, great poverty, hunger, and a growing number of natural disasters. Within our own country, disagreements among people have caused separated families and damaged communities. Jesus came into a world very much like today—a world that wasn't working.

This year's summer camp curriculum is called *Another Way*. A way that calls us to trust in God and rest in Jesus. It is a way that obeys Jesus's words leading us to practice love and kindness. Campers will explore the kind of community where people are welcomed and loved. They will experience exciting opportunities to challenge themselves and have fun in a safe and caring environment.

The scripture for this year is Lamentations 3:22a (ESV) *The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases.* This came out of a very difficult period for the Hebrew people, and the verse reminds them that God's love surrounds us constantly. Camp Mack is a place where that love can be obviously felt and experienced.
